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SCHEDULED CASTES COMPONENT

The Budgetary Classification System provides normative frame work for both policy Formulation and Accountability. Hither to the Government have been following Plan & Non-Plan system of Classification. Now, as per the decision of the Government of India, to merge Plan & Non-Plan expenditure and Classify the Government expenditure under Capital and Revenue, the budget allocations are made accordingly.

As the distinction between Plan & Non-Plan has been removed and there is no Plan from the fiscal year 2017-18, the allocation for the Scheduled Castes Component will be based on percentage of total schemes allocation for both Centrally Sponsored Schemes and State Government schemes and by duly ensuring that the allocation to the Scheduled Castes Component will not be less than the percentage of SC Population.

On these lines, Budget allocation for 2017-18, is made for the schemes which would secure direct and quantifiable benefits to Scheduled Castes Individuals or Scheduled Castes habitations.

An amount of Rs.984713.41 lakhs, has been allocated under Scheduled Castes Component 2017-18. A brief summary of Financial allocation under Scheduled Castes Component 2017-18 is given below.

1. AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT

- **1. Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY):** Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) is one of the Flagship Programmes of Govt. Of India with 60% share from Central Govt., and 40% share from State Govt., to incentivize states for increasing investments in Agriculture and Allied Sectors (Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Fisheries, Sericulture etc.) for implementation of priority based various projects as per the approval State level committee to maximize the returns to the farmers. An amount of Rs.**3993.50** Lakhs is allocated during 2017-18.
- 2. National Food Security Mission (NFSM): The National Food Security Mission scheme launched by Government of India with 60% subsidy from central and 40% from State. The main objective is increasing production of Rice, Wheat, Pulses and Coarse Cereals through area expansion and productivity enhancement in a sustainable manner in the identified Districts of the Andhra Pradesh. The interventions to be implemented under NFSM during 2016-17 are accelerated crop production programmes (cluster Demonstrations), need based inputs (Seeds distribution, INM, IPM, PP Chemicals, farm machines and implements, irrigation devices, capacity building, PMT and local initiatives (need based area specific technologies). An amount of Rs.1199.70 Lakhs is allocated during BE 2017-18 for implementing NFSM schemes of Rice, Pulses, Coarse Cereals and Commercial Crops.
- **3. National Mission On Oilseeds & Oil Palm (NMOOP):** To increase Production and Productivity of oilseeds and Oil palm and to bring additional area under oil palm cultivation by utilization of wastelands with 60% subsidy from Central and 40% from State. This Mission has two Sub-Missions i.e., Mini Mission (MM-I) on Oilseeds. The Mini Mission on Oilseeds envisages increase in Production of vegetable oils sourced from Oilseeds. This Mini Mission-I is implemented by Department of Agriculture. An amount of Rs.403.77 Lakhs is allocated during 2017-18 for implementing MM-I on Oilseeds.
- **4.** National Mission on Agricultural Extension & Technology (NMAET): It has 3 Sub-Missions. Implemented with 60% financial assistance from Central and 40% from State. An amount of **Rs.922.37** Lakhs allocated during the year 2017-18.
- **(i).Sub Mission on Agriculture Extension (SMAE):** It has the key responsibility of disseminating all technology activities at the district level. It has linkages with all the line departments, research organizations, non-governmental organizations and agencies associated with agricultural development in the district and farmer organizations.
- (ii).Sub Mission on Agricultural Mechanisation (SMAM): Farm Mechanization, ensures reduction of drudgery associated with various farm operations and also economize the utilization of inputs and thereby harnessing the potential of available resources. The cost of cultivation is being escalated every year resulting in narrowing the net profit. Among many reasons, cost & availability of labour contributing to the increase in the cost of cultivation. Mechanization of feasible farm operations will address the problem to the maximum extent.

- (iii).Sub Mission on Seed & Planting Material (SMSP): Covers strengthening of seed testing labs, seed farms, Certified seed production through SVP, transport subsidy, seed storage, seed processing plants etc.
- 5. National Mission For Sustainable Agriculture (NMSA): It consists of 2 Sub-Missions.
- (i). Rainfed Area Development Programme (RADP): Increase of Horticultural based area in Rainfed districts due to adoption of efficient water management system by supplying water carrying pipes, creation of water storage structures and soil and moisture activities. An amount of Rs.1131.91 Lakhs is allocated during BE 2017-18. Funding pattern 60:40 (central and state share)
- (ii) Soil Health Card Scheme: The GOI has launched Soil Health Card Scheme on 19.02.2015 with an objective to issue Soil Health Cards to farmers covering all the land holdings within a period of three years. The total landholdings/farmers will be covered once in every three years.
 - In irrigated areas, samples should be drawn in a grid of 2.5 ha. In rainfed areas sampling should be done in 10 ha grid.
 - In irrigated areas, large, medium and semi-medium holdings should be sampled and tested holding wise. In case of marginal and small holdings sampling should be done in 2.5ha grid.
 - In rainfed areas all the large holdings should be sampled and tested holding wise and in case of medium, semimedium, small & marginal holdings sampling should be done in 10ha grid.

As per the guidelines of GOI the sharing pattern of funds for implementation of scheme is 60:40.

6. Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana:

Promotion of Organic Farming in clusters under PGS (Participatory Guarantee System). An amount of Rs.**400.00** Lakhs allocated during 2017-18

7. Prime Minister Fasal Bima Yojana:

Crop Insurance scheme. An amount of Rs. 12671.40 Lakhs allocated during 2017-18

- **8. Farm Mechanisation:** Agricultural mechanization helps in increasing production, productivity and profitability in Agriculture by achieving timeliness in farm operations. Farm equipment like land preparatory, sowing equipment, plant protection equipment etc., are being supplied under subsidy. Custom Hiring Centres and Implement Hiring Stations are also introduced in mandals for major crops grown in the State like Paddy, Maize, Ground nut, Cotton and other crops like Tobacco to make High cost machinery available to small and marginal farmers. An amount of Rs.**2932.60** Lakhs is allocated for Farm Mechanisation scheme during BE 2017-18.
- **9. Extension:** Capacity Building of Farmers, Farm Women and Farmer groups through farmer trainings, <u>Polam Pilusthondi</u> to upgrade skills and knowledge through transfer technologies to address the production gaps. To create a favourable attitude in farmers towards modern cultivation and maximizing their potential by rising awareness levels, pro-change attitude. Strengthening of RMGs to function as the interface between the Agricultural Extension system and Farmers for transfer of technology, access to market information and other farm related advice. Padipantalu magazines are printed and supplied to the farmers for creating awareness. MPEOs are placed to strengthen the agricultural extension network through facilitating effective extension

reach to the farming community, addressing the immediate needs of the farmers during the season in case of un favourable seasonal conditions and sensitize the farmers on measures to be taken up to enhance the productivity levels. An amount of Rs.935.37 Lakhs is allocated during BE 2017-18.

- **10. Integrated Nutrient Management:** Analysis of soil samples has indicated that 40-49% of soils in Andhra Pradesh are potentially deficient in Zinc, Iron, Manganese and boron. It is evident that 10-20 % of the yield will be increased due to correction of Micro Nutrients deficiency by application of micro nutrients to the soils. Under INM programme mainly Zinc Sulfate and other micro nutrients is supplied to enhance Agriculture productivity through soil test based application. The fertilizer control labs are also strengthened. To increase productivity, it is planned to supply required quantities of micronutrients to farmers on 50% subsidy. In addition to soil application foliar application is also proposed to correct the micronutrient deficiency. An amount of **Rs.989.62 Lakhs** is allocated during BE 2017-18.
- **11. Pavala Vaddi:** Pavala Vaddi **is a bank linked scheme to** provide financial support to the farming community and to encourage the farmers for timely repayment of crop loans. Pavala Vaddi is applicable for crop loans for the loan amount more than Rs.1.00 lakh and upto 3.00 Lakhs. An amount of Rs.**80.00** Lakhs is allocated during BE 2017-18.
- **12. Polambadi:** The main objective of Polambadi is to reduce the cost of cultivation and increase the productivity duly empowering the farmers to take economical decisions by adopting practices of integrated crop management. The Polambadi programme is being organized by MAO and AEO in crop period from seed to seed for 14 sessions/ weeks in 10ha of land and 30 number of farmers in each Polambadi unit. An amount of Rs.**24.19** Lakhs is allocated during BE 2017-18.
- **13. Chandranna Rythu Kshetralu:** Chandranna Rythu Kshetram is a new On Farm Demonstration Programme implemented in the farmers field itself, to promote best agronomic and farm management practices for achieving increase in productivity and reducing the cost of cultivation. It is planned to organize a demonstration programme by each AEO/AO/ADA of the department in a cluster of 10 ha with number of farmers not exceeding 5 per each cluster and each farmer having not exceeding 2ha of land. An amount of **Rs. 294.52** Lakhs is allocated during BE 2017-18.
- **14. Soil and Water conservation programme:** The main objective is to retain the moisture for longer period and also to increase the productivity soil conservation measures are to be coupled with agronomic practices for higher production by adopting recommendations of Agriculture Universities for rainfed cultivation practices thereby improving indigenous cultivation practices. An amount of Rs.160.00 Lakhs is allocated during BE 2017-18.
 - Under this programme the pilot model on Ground Water Collectivization and networking of bore wells to provide at least one assured irrigation to rain fed crops during kharif season is proposed to be up scaled in Ananthapur and replication of the pilot model in Kurnool, Chittoor through WASSAN an NGO, Lead Technical Agency.
 - Proposal for Ground Water Governance through PR Institutions through FAO Led NGO APFAMGS in 4 Rayalaseema districts and part of Prakasam is proposed in 518 habitations.

2. HORTICULTURE DEPARTMENT:

1. Pradhana Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojana (PMKSY) APMIP

A.P Micro Irrigation Project (APMIP), is the unique and first comprehensive project being implemented in a big way in Andhra Pradesh for the past 13 years. APMIP was launched on November-2003 with an objective of enhancing the crop productivity by improving the water use efficiency through Micro Irrigation systems for the benefit of the farmers. It is an ongoing project and so far 6.93 lakh ha. has been covered under Micro irrigation in all the 13 Districts in the State since inception i.e., from 2003 to 2016, benefiting 6.25 lakh farmers.

In view of deficit Rainfall, Rain shadow regions, unpredictable rains and considerable depletion of ground water there is no option for farmers except going for Drip Irrigation. To achieve the concept of "More crop per Drop " Micro irrigation is to be taken up particularly in the Districts of Rayalaseema, which are most back ward areas, apart from other back ward areas in Andhra Pradesh. From 2015-16 onwards, Micro Irrigation is being implemented under PMKSY with funding pattern of 60:40 between Central and State Government. An amount of Rs.8700.00 Lakhs is provided in 2017-18.

2. Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH)

A Centrally Sponsored Scheme – National Horticulture Mission (NHM) is being implemented in the State by the State Horticulture Mission. The focus of the programme is to provide comprehensive development of all the sub-sectors of Horticulture so as to provide additional income to Horticulture growers. This programme is under implementation in 9 districts (Srikakulam, West Godavari, Guntur, Prakasam, SPSR Nellore, Chittoor, YSR Kadapa, Ananathapuramu, and Kurnool) and two tribal areas of Rampachodavaram of East Godavari and Paderu of Visakhapatnam districts. Andhra Pradesh, with its high growth trajectory, a large population, significant dependence on agriculture and Horticulture and an extensive coastline is likely to become a significant player in production and marketing of Horticultural produce.

Later, this programme was renamed as "Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH)" and is implemented w.e.f April 2014 by subsuming six schemes on Horticulture Development including NHM as per the revised cost norms and pattern of assistance.

The major components covered under MIDH are a) Area Expansion (Perennial and Non-Perennial crops), b) Rejuvenation of senile orchards, c) Protected Cultivation, d) Post Harvest Management, e) Creation of Water Resources (Farm Ponds) f) Farm Mechanization and g) Capacity Building. An amount of Rs.**1630.12** Lakhs is provided for 2017-18

3. National Mission on Oil Seeds and Oil Palm Programme (NMOOP)Mini Mission-II

Andhra Pradesh ranks 1st in cultivation of Oilpalm with 1.49 lakh Ha with 1.04 lakh farmers in 8 districts of Andhra Pradesh spreading over in 225 mandals. The average productivity of bearing plantations is 19.81 tons FFB per Ha., Out of 1.49 lakh Ha., the bearing area is 1.12 lakh Ha from which the production is 11.47 lakh MTs of FFB with 1.93 lakh MTs of COP during last year. West Godavari district has highest area under Oil palm i.e., 78427 Ha.

13 Processing units were established by Oil Palm Companies with Capacity of 240 MT/Hr., which are working with Government under this programme. An amount of Rs.**940.26** Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18

4. Promotion of Horticulture Activities (State Plan)

In Andhra Pradesh under Primary Sector Mission lot of emphasis has been given to Horticulture sector as it has been identified as best growth engine for overall development of the primary sector. Many innovative schemes like Area Expansion, Canopy Management in Cashes etc taken up. An amount of Rs.**1744.37** Lakhs is allocated for 2017-18.

3.SERICULTURE:

The Sericulture Department will take up the following works during 2017-18

- Area expansion under Mulberry & Tasar Cultivation by SC & ST Farmers.
- Ensuing supply of 100% Bivoltine Chawkie Worms to farmers under Mulberry and DFLS to Tasar farmers to increase quality and productivity of Bivoltine Cocoons.
- Strengthening of Extension efficiency through Training, workshops and publicity.
- Cluster approach in pre & post cocoon sectors (i.e., Mulberry cultivation, Silkworm rearing, Silk reeling, Twisting, Weaving sectors.)

An amount of Rs.200.00 Lakhs is allocated for the year 2017-18

4. REGISTRAR OF CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES:

Integrated Cooperative Development Project (ICDP) is being implemented by the Department as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme with the financial assistance of National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) with a core objective of improving infrastructure facilities of societies and to provide Margin Money assistance to societies including the functional societies like Fisheries, Dairies and Handloom etc. Under this scheme, assistance is provided for development of Agricultural production, supply of Agriculture inputs, Marketing, Storage and processing activity.

Under ICDP, emphasis is given on infrastructure development by village level cooperatives, such as establishment of modern office & banking facilities, setting up of consumer shop, construction of scientific storage, godowns; facilities for food processing for valve addition; marketing of agriculture and horticulture produce etc. Keeping in view, the importance of manpower development and training, the Scheme provide subsidy for training, managerial assistance for project implementation and monitoring and preparation of project report and documentation etc.

An amount of Rs.88.00 Lakhs is allocated during 2017-18.

5. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY:

Under Integrated Livestock Management, the following schemes were taken up.

a. Heifer induction and rearing programme:

A scheme designed to develop replacement of breeding stock through heifer induction followed by rearing support to reduce the age at first conception in female cattle. The elite heifer's

will be inducted and enrolled in the first year of the programme and support will be given for insurance, feed, fodder, health care and other support activities up to the age of 28 months in case of cross breeds or 36 months in case of buffaloes or till the date of calving whichever is earlier.

The additional milk production in the state is estimated to be 0.15 LMTs after complete implementation of this programme.

b. Feeding support to animals owned by SCs:

The animals owned by SCs will be given feed and fodder support on subsidy basis as per the policy of the AH department.

c. Ongole Male Calf Rearing:

To conserve Ongole breed of cattle and as income generating activity to SHG it is proposed to encourage rearing of male Ongole cattle involving SHG group in the breeding tract with 90% subsidy. It is proposed to implement this activity in Ongole cattle breeding tract in the state.

d. Pregnant and lactating animal care (Kheerasagar):

It is a scheme designed to reduce inter calving period in milch animals, so that the life time milk production from the animals treated will get increased.

The insurance, feed support and other logistics will be given for a period of six months (Last 3 months of pregnancy and first 3 months of lactation).

- To reduce the inter calving period in cattle from 24 months to 18 months with better nutrition.
- An additional 360 litres of milk and one calf extra can be obtained from each animal in its life time.

e. Calf Rearing Scheme (Sunandini):

It is a scheme designed to develop replacement of breeding stock within the state instead of animal induction and to reduce the age at first conception in female cattle. The elite female calves at the age of 4-6 months will be enrolled in the first year of the programme and support will be given for feed, health care and other support activities up to the age of 28 months or till the date of calving whichever is earlier. Only heifer calves owned by SC families will be enrolled and given support of 75% subsidy on inputs and insurance cost for a period of 2 years.

(870) kg of protein rich concentrate feed will be supplied to the enrolled calves over a period of two years. Periodical deworming together with mineral supplementation will also be given apart from providing medicines for calf scours or any other infection under health coverage. Orientation programme will be organized for the selected beneficiaries on calf feeding and management.

The support for 2nd year will also be continued for the calves already enrolled earlier based on specific proposals received from districts.

The additional milk production in the state is estimated to be 0.30 LMTs after complete implementation of this programme.

f. Fertility Management of animals owned by SC:

After calving, the milch animals are required to be managed for ideal service period. When management of animals for reproductive healthcare is taken care of, ideal service period can be maintained in animals so that the milch animals can give more calves during its life time.

g. Manakodi:

Rural Backyard Poultry offers excellent scope to improve nutritional status of SC families in rural areas. The scheme will be implemented as per the norms of GOI. It is proposed to implement the programme with an outlay of Rs.300.00 Lakhs to support (2000) SC families in the state.

An amount of Rs.5959.00 Lakhs allocated during the year 2017-18.

6. FISHERIES DEPARTMENT:

The following schemes are implemented under the "Scheme for Relief and Welfare of Fishermen belonging to Scheduled Castes".

1. Assistance to Retail Fish marketing by supply of Cycle with Nets and Ice boxes

The objective of the scheme is to provide Cycle with nets and ice box to active fishers to support and enhance their livelihood and also to create employment opportunities.

Unit Cost and Pattern of Assistance: The unit cost of all these three items is fixed at Rs.15, 000/-depending on the type of Cycle, ice box and nets. The subsidy will be 90% of the unit cost or actual cost whichever is less with a maximum ceiling of Rs.13,500/-. The balance 10% of unit cost will be beneficiary contribution or bank loan. No. of units proposed is 10133 and the Budget Estimate is Rs. **1367.96** Lakhs.

2. Supply of two wheelers with ice box/ Freezer mounted Mopeds for fish vending/ two wheelers with ice box for shrimp seed transport

The Objective of the Scheme is to increase domestic fish consumption, to supply fish to consumers in hygienic and fresh conditions and to supply the shrimp and fish directly to processing units thereby improving livelihoods.

Unit Cost and Pattern of Assistance: The unit cost not exceeding Rs.0.60 Lakhs depending on the requirement of trade. The subsidy will be 90% of the unit cost or actual cost of the unit whichever less subject to maximum ceiling of Rs.0.54 Lakhs is. The balance 10% of unit cost will be beneficiary contribution or bank loan. The No. of units proposed is 1500 and the Budget Estimate is Rs. **810.00** Lakhs.

3. Assistance to Retail Fish marketing by supply of Three Wheelers with Ice boxes

The objective of the scheme is to increase domestic fish consumption, to ensure access of the poor to nutritious food, to supply fish to consumers in hygienic and fresh conditions besides improved livelihoods

Unit cost and Pattern of Assistance: The unit cost is Rs.3,00,000/-. The subsidy shall be 90% of the unit cost or actual cost whichever is less subject to maximum ceiling of Rs.2.70 Lakhs. The balance 10% of unit cost can be beneficiary contribution or bank loan. No. of units proposed is 210 and the Budget proposed is Rs.567.00 Lakhs.

4. Assistance to Retail Fish marketing by supply of Four Wheelers with Ice boxes

The Objectives of the scheme is to increase domestic fish consumption, to ensure access of the poor to nutritious food and Supply fish to consumers in hygienic, and fresh conditions

Unit Cost and Pattern of Assistance: The unit cost of Four wheeler including accessories should not exceed Rs. 4, 40,000/-. The subsidy shall be 90% of the unit cost whichever less subject to maximum ceiling of Rs.3.96 Lakhs is. The balance 10% of unit cost can be beneficiary contribution or bank loan. No. of units proposed is 150 and the Budget Estimate is Rs.594.00 Lakhs.

5. Supply of Ice boxes to Fishers:

The Objective of the Scheme is to sell the fish in fresh and hygienic condition where the sellers will get good price and the consumer will get quality fish.

Unit Cost and Pattern of Assistance: The unit cost of ice box (100 liter) will be Rs.6000.00. The subsidy shall be 90% of the unit cost i.e., Rs.5400/unit or 90% of the actual cost of the unit whichever is less. The balance 10% of unit cost will be beneficiary contribution or by bank loan. No. of units proposed is 3000 and the Budget Estimate is Rs.162.00 Lakhs

6.Assistance for Establishment of Fish retail Kiosk

The Objective of the scheme is to increase domestic fish consumption, to popularise the modern fish processing and preservation technologies, to ensure access of the poor to nutritious protein food, to make available the supply of hygienic fish to consumers in fresh conditions and to increase the per capita fish consumption.

Unit Cost and Pattern of Assistance: The unit cost will be upto Rs. 10, 00,000/-. The subsidy shall be 90% of the unit cost or actual cost whichever is less with a maximum ceiling of Rs.9.00 Lakhs. The balance 10% of unit **cost** can be beneficiary contribution or bank loan. No. of units proposed is 70 and the Budget Estimate is Rs. 630.00 Lakhs.

7. Supply of Fish seed transport vans

The objective of the scheme is to provide assets by supplying fish seed transport vans to support their livelihood.

Unit Cost and Pattern of Assistance: The unit cost is fixed up to Rs.10.00 Lakhs depending on the type of van. The subsidy will be 90% of the unit cost or actual cost whichever is less subject to maximum ceiling of Rs.9.00 Lakhs. The balance 10% of unit cost will be beneficiary contribution or bank loan. The No. of units proposed is 200 and the budget proposed is Rs. 1800.00 Lakhs.

A total amount of Rs.**5931.00** Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18 for Scheme for Relief and Welfare of SC Fishermen.

GP Kandukur and GP Nellore and construction of hostel buildings for SC Students in the existing Government Model Residential Polytechnics in Rajamahendravaram and Madanapalli, and to meet the amenities in GMR Polytechnics.

An amount of Rs.1430.00 Lakhs allocated in 2017-18.

8. COLLEGIATE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT:

The Department will taken up the activities such as Student Interactive Programmes like, Group discussions, Seminars, Study projects etc. Infrastructure facilities to the two colleges sanctioned. Text books will be provided to the SC students studying in Degree Colleges.

An amount of Rs. 2441.97 Lakhs allocated in 2017-18.

9. INTERMEDIATE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT:

The Department will take up the activities such as supply of text books to SC students studying in Govt/Aided colleges at free of cost. Construction of additional class rooms and accommodation in needy Government Jr Colleges where the SC student strength is more than 40 %. And also to take up construction of Attached Hostels in needy Government Jr Colleges where the SC student strength is more than 40 % to facilitate the students.

An amount of Rs.700.00 Lakhs allocated in 2017-18

10. ENERGY DEPARTMENT:

The Department will take up the Programmes like Electrification of Dalith Bastis, Energisation of Borewells and Providing of 2 more LED bulbs to the SC households.

An amount of Rs. 7333.17 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

11. SCHOOL EDUCATION:

The Department will utilise the budget for meeting the Cooking Cost of the Midday Meal and take up activities, providing quality education. organising excursion trips, supply of study Kits for Maths, conducting Motivation Camps for girl students and providing training to girls for self-defense etc.

SARVA SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (SSA):

Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan is a centrally sponsored scheme being implemented in the state since 2001-02 to attain Universal Elementary Education. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, Andhra Pradesh is the implementing society for Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan. After passage of RTE Act, SSA has been identified as main vehicle to implement the provisions of the Act. Government of India and State Government release funds, as per the ratio fixed by Government of India from time to time.

- All children in school, Education Guarantee Centre, Alternative School, Back-to-School camp.
- All children complete eight years of elementary schooling.
- Focus on elementary education of satisfactory quality with emphasis on education for life.
- Bridge all gender and social category gaps at elementary education level
- Universal retention.

Interventions:

- Civil Works Construction of School Buildings, Addl. Classrooms, MRC Buildings, Rooms for School Complexes, Toilets, Electrification & drinking water facilities.
- Release of Maintenance grant to Schools with own buildings.
- Release of School Grants & Teacher Grants for all schools.
- Training to Teachers with special emphasis to the SC / ST located schools for improving quality of the teaching.
- Supply of two pairs of uniforms to the children studying in Government schools upto 8th class every year.
- Transport facility will be provided to the long distance habitations especially in tribal areas.
 - 1. Two Special Residential Schools are being functioned to the Urban deprived children and 13 hostels are also being functioned in urban areas for urban deprived children.
 - 2. Special schools are being maintained in each mandal headquarters to take care the Children with Special Needs
 - 3. Special camps are being organized in Tribal & Schedule Caste Concentrated Areas to cover the Out of School Children.
 - 4. Kasturba Gandhi Baalika Vidyalaya: The Government of India launched the "Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBV)" with boarding facilities at elementary level for girls belonging predominantly to SC, ST, BC and Minorities in Educationally Backward Blocks in the state in 2004-05.

An amount of Rs.43911.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

12.ADULT EDUCATION

The Department will conduct Basic Literacy Programme covering 1,00,000 learners in the age group of 15 years and above, non-literates among the Scheduled Castes. In this programme each Village Co-Ordinator will teach 35 learners each. An amount of Rs.230/- required per learner as per the National Literacy Mission Norms.

An amount of Rs.31.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

13. CIVIL SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT:

An Amount of Rs.**11000.00** Lakhs is allocated for the year 2017-18 for Distribution of LPG Connections to women in rural areas / Municipal Areas.

14. PUBLIC HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE DEPARTMENT:

The Department will provide Medicines to the Poor Urban / Rural SC patients. An amount of Rs.**5553.00** Lakhs is allocated for the year 2016-17 towards Centralised purchases of Drugs and Medicines.

15. FAMILY WELFARE DEPARTMENT:

The Department will take up the activities such as <u>NATIONAL HEALTH MISSION</u>: NHM programmes contain RCH Flexi pool and Mission Flexi pool. In RCH Flexi pool major components are Maternal Health, Child heath, Family Planning, RBSK,RKSK, Tribal RCH,Training, HR,Programme Management etc. In Mission Flexi pool, the major components are ASHA, Hospital Strengthening New Constructions, Spill over constructions, AYUSH etc. In immunisation the components are Routine Immunization, Strengthening Project, Cold Chain Maintenance, ASHA incentive etc. In Communicable diseases the components are IDSP, NVBDCP, NLEP, RNTCP. The non Communicable diseases Programme consisting of NTCP, National programme for prevention and control of cancer, Diabetes, Cardio Vascular disease and stroke, National Trachoma & Blindness Control Programme National Health Mission Programme.

CHANDRANNA SANCHARA CHIKISTHA: The Habitations which are 3 KMs away from the Primary Health centre are covered by the Chandranna Sanchara Chikistha — affixed day health service programme at the door steps of the rural people for providing the health services by the team of Doctor, Staff nurse, lab technician, pharmacist and pilot shall visit the villages and attend the health services to the chronic patients and ante natal mothers. They shall visit on a fixed day in a month and shall dispense all the required drugs for a period of one month if required and also conduct all required tests for diagnosis. A total of 277 vehicles are serving the state

REHS-108 Services: In order to provide Emergency Health Care services to the people met with accidents, ante natal mothers and other fatally ill patients, 439 ambulances are proposed under 108 Services. Operational Cost per ambulance per month is Rs.1,30,001/-. The services are providing the golden hour opportunity for treatment of critically ill patients duly transporting them to the designated hospitals and saving thousands of lives.

Janani Surakhsha Yojana: To encourage institutional deliveries and to decrease IMR & MMR, an amount of Rs.700/- and 300/- per Rural Pregnant women who comes for delivery to the Govt. Institutions will be paid as incentive and wage compensation. The SC women are availing services.

- SHG women who are in the age group of 18-59 years are eligible to join

4. Capital Infusion to DWACRA Women Groups

Background:

With a view to accelerate inclusive economic development of farmers and women, the Government established an expert committee under the chairmanship of Sri P. Kotaiah, former Chairman of NABARD. The Government, has carefully reviewed the expert committee report, held extensive consultations with the stakeholders, and after considering all options for speedier economic empowerment of women's groups (DWCRA Groups) in rural and urban areas for accelerated poverty elimination and improvement in social and human development indicators, has decided to provide Capital Grants to the Self-Help Groups (SHG /DWCRA Groups) that would enable the women's group to increase its borrowing capacity, leverage additional credit from the financial institution, diversify the investment portfolio and produce better quality products, expand marketing avenues and in the process improve income generation on a sustainable basis and reinvest surplus income in nutrition, education, skills, health and other activities that would enhance the quality of life of the family.

Unit Cost:

State Government has decided to reinforce the women empowerment efforts and strengthen the economic development of rural as well as urban poor households and hereby order for infusion of capital to the SHG / DWCRA groups @ Rs.10, 000 for every member of the Group.

Eligibility

- a) Which are in the APMSS database as on 31.3.2014, based on their membership.
- b) Members whose Aadhar numbers verified are only considered.
- c) SHGs whose savings accounts in the bank are verified by the field staff.

It is proposed to cover 16,76,173 Beneficiaries with outlay of Rs. 58819.57 Lakhs in 2017-18.

6. National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM):

Institution Building for strengthening CBOs and CIF livelihoods for Women SHGs schemes are planned under NRLM:

Background

The Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes are the disadvantaged people among communities and need special attention. Strengthening efforts by SERP have been made by SERP by adopting various social mobilization and institutional strategies in bringing them in SHGs and various capacity building efforts have been made by SERP to make them self sustainable by promoting income generation activities.

- The situation analysis of the SCs /STs conducted by SERP has found the following gaps in the CBOs formed with SCs SHG members.
- SHGs at SC places have no regular meetings, savings, internal lending's, good recovery performance and good bookkeeping practices. About 40 to 60 % have become defunct.
- Village Organizations and Mandal Samakhyas have poor attendance SC SHGs members in their meetings.
- Recovery of CIF loans is poor at SHG, VO and MS level.
- The information flow of the related activities on found wanting with the SCs & STs by way
 of sharing of best practices, training and monitoring of activities.

6.1 Institutional Building:

Proposed activities:

- Bringing all leftover SC Community members into SHG fold through external CRP strategy
- Revival and Strengthening of "C" and "D" grade SHGs by engaging SHG Trainers
- Financial Literacy to SHGs in all MSs,
- Conducting trainings to MS /VO Functional Committees,
- Promoting mobile banking ,tablet & web based accounting in CBOs
- Trainings to CBO staff on technology based accounting
- Project staff Trainings

Expected Outcomes:

- Around 15,000 SHGs will be following "Pragathi Ki Padi Sutralu" and will be in "A"
- All 15,000 SHGs will be having 100% of repayment in internal lending, CIF, Stree Nidhi and Bank loans
- At least 1/10th of the members will take up livelihood activities
- Around 250 VOs will be in " A" grade

- All eligible SC members should access loans from the fund meant for them apart from Sthree Nidhi loans and repay on time
- CIF Repayment rate will be improved at MS level (at least 5% more than the existing repayment rate)

An amount of Rs. 287.66 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

29. RURAL WATER SUPPLY DEPARTMENT:

The RWS & S Department is responsible for providing infrastructure for supply of Drinking Water and construction of sanitation facilities in habitations in Rural Areas.

Safe Drinking Water Supply is a very important issue as over 80% of health problems are due to consumption of unsafe water. Because of increasing health awareness among the rural public additional attention is to be paid to the subject. Hence, one of the most important programs of the Government is the provision of safe drinking water to the rural population.

An amount of Rs.**17519.27** is allocated for providing safe drinking water in SC Habitations in 2017-18.

30. SKILL DEVELOPMENT, ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND INNOVATION:

Department of Skill Development, Entrepreneurship, and Innovation promotes and supervises skill developmental activities in a number of areas for a number of people in a variety of sectors. It also promotes various programmes for improving the skill and work on the attitude of people towards work, use of technologies, tools, and machinery to improve the efficiency of operations. The department promotes entrepreneurship and encourages innovation.

It also monitors implementation of various programmes for sustaining and promoting the quality of education with the objective of enhancing employability and promoting innovation driven entrepreneurship to the students particularly those hailing from marginalized sections of the society.

An amount of Rs. **8435.00** Lakhs is allocated in the year 2017-18 for implementing above programmes for SC Youth.

31. SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT:

1. Social Welfare Department implements various schemes for the Educational advancement, Socio-economic development, Welfare and Protection of Scheduled Castes in the state.

2. POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIPS:

Post Matric Scholarships is a flag ship programme of Govt. of A.P. for providing total Tution fee (RTF) and maintenance (MTF) to all eligible SC Students who are having the family income of Rs.2.00 Lakhs Per Annum and pursuing studies from ITI to Ph.D. on saturation mode. The scheme is completely operational online and Aadhar authenticated.

MTF to the students is given every month and Tuition Fee (RTF) will be released every quarter in Post Matric Scholarships.

An amount of Rs. 70596.20 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18 for MTF and RTF (Tuition Fee).

3. PRF MATRIC SCHOLARSHIPS:

Pre Matric Scholarships for the students studying 5th to 8th class:-

- Pre Matric Scholarships scheme is implemented to improve the retention levels and continuation of their Education from upper primary to secondary level.
- Pre Matric Scholarships (Rs.150 per month for girls and Rs.100 per month for boys for 10 months) are sanctioned to the students studying 5th to 8th classes in all Government / Aided Schools.
- The scheme is made fully online and Aadhar based.
- An amount of Rs.4780.35 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

4. PRE MATRIC SCHOLARSHIPS TO 9TH TO 10TH STUDENTS:

- Pre Matric Scholarships (Rs.150 per month for 10 months and Rs.750 adhoc grant per annum for days scholars and Rs.350 per month for 10 months and Rs.1000 adhoc grant for hostellers) are sanctioned to the students studying 9th to 10th classes in all Government / Aided Schools.
- An amount of Rs.4000.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

5. UPGRADATION OF MERIT TO SC STUDENTS:

- Under the scheme an amount of Rs.25,000/- is provided for Merit Upgradation of SC students pursing residential education in Intermediate.

 and one way economy air fare and visa fee for pursuing MBBS/Professional PG / Ph.D level
 studies in Foreign Countries.

An amount of Rs.3300.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18

7. SKILL UPGRADATION FOR PROFESSIONAL GRADUATES:

• The Govt. have introduced the scheme to facilitate coaching for GRE/GMAT/TOEFL/IELTS in reputed coaching institutes to secure admissions in various universities in Abroad and in turn to get benefitted under Ambedkar Overseas Vidhya Nidhi Scheme

An amount of Rs.225.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

8. NTR VIDYONNATHI:

- Under "NTR Vidyonnathi" scheme Professional Guidance for Civil Services Examination is provided by sponsoring the SC students to reputed coaching institutions in the Country.
- For the year 2017-18 an amount of Rs.**1800.00** Lakhs is allocated to provide guidance to 700 students

9. BEST AVAILABLE SCHOOLS:

- To provide qualitative English Medium education to the SC Students in their Districts, Government have introduced the Best Available Schools schemes for the students studying 1st to 10th Classes in selected reputed English medium schools with Residential and Non-residential facilities.
- During the year 2017-18 an amount of Rs.**3870.00** Lakhs is allocated to cover 14,700 students under the scheme.

10. BOOK BANK SCHEME:

- Under this scheme Text Books and Reference Books are provided for SC students pursuing Professional courses like Engineering, Medical, Agriculture, Law, MBA etc.,
- An amount of Rs.850.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

11. REHABILITATION SCHEME FOR BONDED LABOUR:

- Rehabilitation of Bonded Labour identified in the Districts is taken up through APSCCFC Ltd.
 Fresh survey of the bonded labours is being taken up by the District level committee headed by the District Collector. At present an amount Rs.20,000 is given for each released bonded labour.
- An amount of Rs.100.00 Lakhs is proposed in 2017-18.

12. PROMOTION OF INTER CASTE MARRIAGES:

- Govt. have been encouraging Inter-caste Marriages for Social Integration and Social Reform

- 3. Under this Scheme, SC students are also sponsored to Reputed Coaching Institutions in the State, for providing guidance for Group-I, Group-II Examinations.
- 4. It is proposed to give guidance to all Competitive Examinations to SC Unemployed Youth.

An amount of Rs. 550.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18

14. CONTRIBUTION TO SW FUND:

• To encourage, help and strengthen the registered Voluntary Organizations which are engaged in Social Welfare activities, financial assistance is provided under the scheme. (The AP Social Welfare Fund came into existence during 1975).

An amount of Rs.35.00 Lakhs allocated under the Scheme.

 established to assist the Nodal Agency to carry out various studies, gap analysis, and
 designing new schemes etc., and to develop IT initiatives, Decision Support Systems etc.,
- An amount of Rs.2194.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18

18. PROVISION OF FREE POWER TO SC HOUSE HOLDS:

- Under the scheme, Social Welfare Department pays the Electricity bill of SC House holds consuming 0 50 units of electricity, per month.
- An amount of Rs.15923.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

19. SPL. CRIMINAL COURTS DEALING WITH OFFENCES UNDER IPC & PCR AND POA ACTS, AGAINST SCS & STS:

 Under the scheme an amount of Rs.3032.15 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18 for assistance to Special Sessions Courts dealing with offences under IPC & PCR and POA Acts, against SCs & STs and to PCR cell, under CA to SDP.

20. MONETARY RELIEF & LEGAL AID TO THE VICTIMS OF ATROCITIES:

- Under the Scheme Relief as prescribed by the Government is paid to the victims of atrocities.
- An amount of Rs.400.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18.

AP SC COOP. Finance Corporation Limited

- Objective of the Corporation is to provide financial assistance for creation of income generating assets to the poor Scheduled Caste households for their social & economic development.
- Schemes being taken up include Purchase of Agricultural Lands, Bore Wells, Tube Wells, Submersible Pump sets, Pipe Lines, Milch Animals, Energization of Minor Irrigation Schemes, Filter points, Schemes under ISB sector with bank tie-up and various Skill Development Training Programmes with special emphasis on Vulnerable sections like Scavengers / SafaiKaramcharis, Bonded Labour, Flayers & Tanners, Jogins, Self-Employment Schemes under NSFDC & NSKFDC.

The following are the few initiatives /intervention taken up by APSCCFC LTD.

1. E-payments:

Bank linked schemes through e-payment system of **direct release of subsidy** in**to beneficiaries' loan account** from Head Office from Nov'2013 is implemented.

Accordingly, SC Corporation started implementing the direct release of subsidy through e-payment system.

2. OBMMS:

'Online Beneficiary Monitoring & Management System' (OBMMS) software developed with assistance of the Centre for Good Governance (C.G.G) to facilitate transparency, accountability, avoid duplication and curtail the delays in the implementation of the schemes. The OBMMS package is under implementation in all the 13 districts.

3. Loan Recovery Tracker

For sharing the data from Banks, it is proposed to develop Loan Recovery Tracking module for tracking the recovery data of Welfare schemes implemented by all Welfare Corporations.

Accordingly, Government have permitted to entrust the work to Tata Consultancy Services for Designing, Development, implementation and Maintenance of ICT system of recovery of loans module.

4. Third party verification/ Audit of the Units

Third party verification will be done by the selected agency in two phases i.e., after 6th and 15th month and submit the verification details in the prescribed proforma to the concerned ED for uploading the same in OBMMS portal.

5. Geo-tagging of the Grounded units

After every six months, the Panchayat Secretary/ SHG groups will take geo-tagging photograph of the unit and submit the same to the concerned ED for uploading in the OBMMS portal.

6. Web portal for Skill Development Training Programmes

A separate web site is created (youthwayap.org) for registration of educated SC unemployed youth those who are seeking job oriented / Self-employment oriented trainings to improve their employable skills for getting jobs and to take up self-employment ventures to live in a decent and dignified livelihood. The APSCCFC Ltd initiated a special awareness camps in all the districts motivating and involving with youth and women.

7. Targets under Tentative SCAP 2017-18

Under 2017-18 Tentative SC Action Plan, 1, 09,217SC beneficiaries have been approved to cover with financial outlay of Rs**1501.86** cr. under different sectors.

9. ASTAs

Ambedkar Skills and Training Academy (ASTA) – The Corporation is imparting placement oriented / Skill Development Training Programs to the SC Educated Unemployed Youth for getting either jobs or to establish self employment economic support schemes to eke-out their livelihood in a better way. However, these training programmes are organized through selected outside training agencies.

To construct permanent training centers for conducting Ambedkar Skills and Training Academies (ASTAs) continuous skill development training programs to the SC educated unemployed youth on residential basis in each of the District. The lands shall be identified abutting the highways and prime localities with convenience to reach for this purpose and buildings can be leased out on rental basis, till the permanent infrastructure is created.

The following Training Programs are proposed to be organized in the above centers.

- 1) Placement oriented training programs.
- 2) Coaching to the aspirants of Govt. services/ Banking service /PSU/PSE services etc.,
- 3) Skill Development training programme for self employment and
- 4) Training to improve soft skills, like numerical ability, mental abilities, aptitude, analytical, abilities, test of reasoning and English language etc as to complete with other category of candidates in a better way in securing jobs.
- 5) High-end trainings linked to certification and placements.

10. Backend Subsidy:

Backend Subsidy was introduced for schemes implemented under SC Action Plan from 2016

11. Land Purchase Scheme

Special focus on Land Purchase Scheme with enhanced unit cost up to Rs 15.00 Lakhs per beneficiary in (3) slabs

- Under the scheme subsidy component of various economic support schemes of APSCCFC Ltd, is met.

32. SOCIAL WELFARE RESIDENTIAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS SOCIETY

GOALS & OBJECTIVES:

With an objective of providing quality education to the children belonging to poor, backward marginalized sections of the Society, separate Residential Schools were started by Government of Andhra Pradesh in the year 1983 under the aegis of AP Social Welfare Residential Educational Institutions Society.

After Re-organization of Andhra Pradesh, [185] Regular institutions have been functioning under the Administrative control of APSWREI Society. The different categories of institutions functioning are mentioned as under:

TOTAL NO.OF INSTITUTIONS - 185 Nos:

(63 Boys, 120 Girls and 2 Co-Education)

Upgraded Institutions with Class V to Intermediate : 151 (46 for Boys & 105 for Girls)

Independent Jr. Colleges with Intermediate : 4 (2 for Boys & 2 for Girls)

Centres of Excellence with Class IX to Intermediate : 2 (Co Education)

Non Upgraded institutions with Class V to X : 28 (15 for Boys & 13 for Girls)

The entry for Admissions are made in Class 5th and I year Intermediate, every year. Admissions for 5th class is through Common Entrance Test and for Intermediate, it is based on SSC marks. Admissions for Class 9th in Centre of Excellence are also through Common Entrance Test.

MAJOR PROGRAMMES / SCHEMES IMPLEMENTED BY THE SOCIETY:

The major objective of APSWREI Society is to provide quality education to the Scheduled Caste students through Residential Schools. The achievements of APSWR Institutions are as follows:

Provided Training to the Craft Teachers of APSWR institutions in Tailoring basics, bakery items and saree dry wash, rolling and polishing in collaboration with Eenadu during September, 2016.

Science Fairs have been named as Curiosity Carnival. The Curiosity Carnival are conducted during September and November months.

4.LITTLE TEACHERS:

An innovative concept of live lecture series by Little teachers (Students) on MANA TV has been introduced in the Society. The live classes on MANA TV by the Little Teachers August, 2016 to November, 2016.

5.SCHOOL RADIO PROGRAMME:

A new innovative initiative project School Radio Programme has been introduced in APSWR institutions from the month of July, 2016 to improve the communication, public speaking skills, skills of research, group discussions, team work etc., among the students.

6.SUPER STUDENTS:

The Society has introduced a novel concept of Super students for students with 100% attendance to improve the regular attendance in all the students. They have been awarded with flight journey to Hyderabad, sight seeing in Hyderabad City for two days and Five Star hotel treatment.

7.SUMMER SPORTS CAMPS:

Conducted Games & Sports Meet to encourage the students to participate in State Level & National Level Games & Sports tournament.

8.SUMMER LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME CONDUCTED FOR STUDENTS:

The students tend to unlearn what they learn in the class room during the summer holidays. To bridge the gap students' leadership programmes have been conducted to boost up the morale, aspirations and confidence level among students.

(13) Students of APSWR institutions have been selected for Mountaineering and sent to special training in Mountaineering at Darjeeling.

14.PARTICIPATION OF STUDENTS IN 2nd WORLD KARATE CHAMPIONSHIP AT ARGENTINA

About (6) students of APSWR School/JC, Satyaveedu, Chittoor district have been selected for participation in 2nd World Karate Championship Karate-do at ARGENTINA.

"Annapurna App" through which data related to food items issued daily to the students will come to Head Office same day (1 core Diet charges were saved n the first month of implementation of this software).

CONVERSION OF HOSTELS IN TO RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS:

To provide quality Education and Better Learning Outcomes to SC students it was decided to convert SW Hostels in to Residential Schools , in a phased manner. So far 453 Hostels were converted and 16,039 Boarders were admitted in to Residential Schools. In 2017-18, it is proposed to admit 16.588 Boarders of 310 SW Hostels in Residential Schools , and 7932 Borders in to IWHC(R.S) from 460 SW Hostels.

An amount of Rs. **74901.00** Lakhs is provided for all activities of APSWREIS , including constructions, repairs and augumentation.

33. ENC R&B (STATE ROADS):

An amount of Rs.1400.00 Lakhs is proposed for the year 2017-18 for laying roads.

34. ENC R&B (RURAL ROADS):

An amount of Rs **1200.00** Lakhs is allocated for the year 2017-18 for construction and development of road works under Rural Infrastructure Development.

35. WOMEN DEVELOPMENT & CHILD WELFARE DEPARTMENT:

Andhra Pradesh is one of the few states in the country where a separate Department is created to look after the Development and Welfare of Women & Children. Since 1973, though a number of programmes have been taken up for Welfare of Women & Children, a separate Dept. in the Secretariat was created in 1987 for effective formulation and implementation of policies for women and children and for evaluating various Programmes intended for their Welfare.

To implement of various programmes an amount of Rs.29845.63 Lakhs is proposed for the year 2017-18.

I. SUPPLEMENTARY NUTRITION PROGRAMME (SNP)

Nutrition is the most important service rendered under ICDS. Broadly three varieties of supplementary food are being provided to the beneficiaries i.e. Pregnant and Lactating women, 06 months to 3 years and 3 to 6 years children. The beneficiaries are target to cover @ 68 per Main AWC and @ 23 per Mini AWC. The amounts proposed as per Government of India cost norms, i.e., Rs 6/ per child, Rs 7/- per Women and Rs 9/- for severely malnourished children per day for 300 days for 48770 main AWCs and 6837 mini AWCs in all 257 ICDS projects.

2 GIRL CHILD PROTECTION SCHEME:-

The new GCPS has been introduced from 01.04.2005 with an aim to prevent gender discrimination by empowering and protecting the rights of Girl Child through direct investment from Government. BPL Families having single girl of 0-3 years of age or two girl children of whom the age of the second girl child is not more than 3 years as on 01.04.2005 are eligible for coverage under the Scheme. The Government have issued amendment to G.O.Ms.No.33, Dt.18.12.2009 enhancing the total annual Income of the family of the Girl Child from Rs. 20,000/- to Rs. 40,000/- per annum for Rural areas and Rs. 24,000/- to Rs.48,000/- for urban areas.

An amount of Rs. 1000.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18

3 MAA INTI MAHALAKSHMI:

The State Government has enacted Andhra Pradesh MAA INTI MAHALAKSHMI Girl Child Promotion and Empowerment Act, 2013 which provides incentives for achieving certain milestones to the Girl Child born after 1st May, 2013 till she reaches the age of 21 years. Government with a view to restore the gender balance to channelize the capabilities of woman for

nation building and to achieve the Millennium Development Goals resolves to prevent gender discrimination by empowering and protecting the girl children and catalysing their all round growth. The Scheme extends to the whole of the state of Andhra Pradesh it shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from 1stMay, 2013. It shall apply to all girl children born on or after 1st May, 2013 in below poverty line families up to 2 Girl Child all are eligible for enroll for **MAA INTI MAHALAKSHMI Scheme.**

An amount of Rs.**620.00** Lakhs is proposed under the scheme.

ANNA AMRUTHA HASTHAM -

(One Full Meal programme for Pregnant and Lactating women)

The State Government introduced "Anna Amrutha Hastham" (AAH) programme which involves spot feeding of "one full meal" for Pregnant and Lactating women at the Anganwadi centre along with administration of Iron & Folic Acid (IFA) tablet. The programme is implementing in ICDS Projects with most adverse health and nutrition indicators in 104 ICDS projects of 23,949 AWCs during 2016-17 for 3.26 Lakhs beneficiaries. The Beneficiaries are target to cover @ 16 per Main AWC and @ 4 per Mini AWC and amounts proposed as per Government norms, i.e., Rs 13/ per Prg. & Lactating women per day for 300 days. In one full meal will provide consisting of Rice, (Dal with leafy vegetables, Sambar/veg curry, one boiled egg and 200 ml milk to all the Pregnant and Lactating women at each AWC at least for 25 days a month.

An amount of Rs. 1620.00 Lakhs is allocated in 2017-18

36. <u>PERSONS WITH DIFFERENTLY ABLED AND SENIOR CITIZENS WELFARE DEPARTMENT:</u>

The Department will provide prosthetic aids like calipers, artificial limbs and hearing aids etc. An amount of Rs. **100.00** Lakhs is allocated for 2017-18

37. <u>CULTURAL AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT:</u>

An amount of Rs.**212.50** Lakhs is allocated the year 2017-18 for providing dresses, instruments for Dalith Artists like Dappulu, Butta Bommalu, Tappetagullu. Puppetry etc.,

38. YOUTH SERVICES DEPT:

An amount of Rs.**21250.00** Lakhs allocated for the year towards Youth Welfare Schemes and Assistance to Un-employed SC Youth.

39. SPORTS AUTHORITY OF ANDHRA PRADESH:

Construction of Indoor Stadium in APSWR Schools, Sports Meet and Sports Material to SC Hostels and Residential Schools will be taken up.

An amount of Rs. 1000.00 Lakhs allocated in 2017-18.
